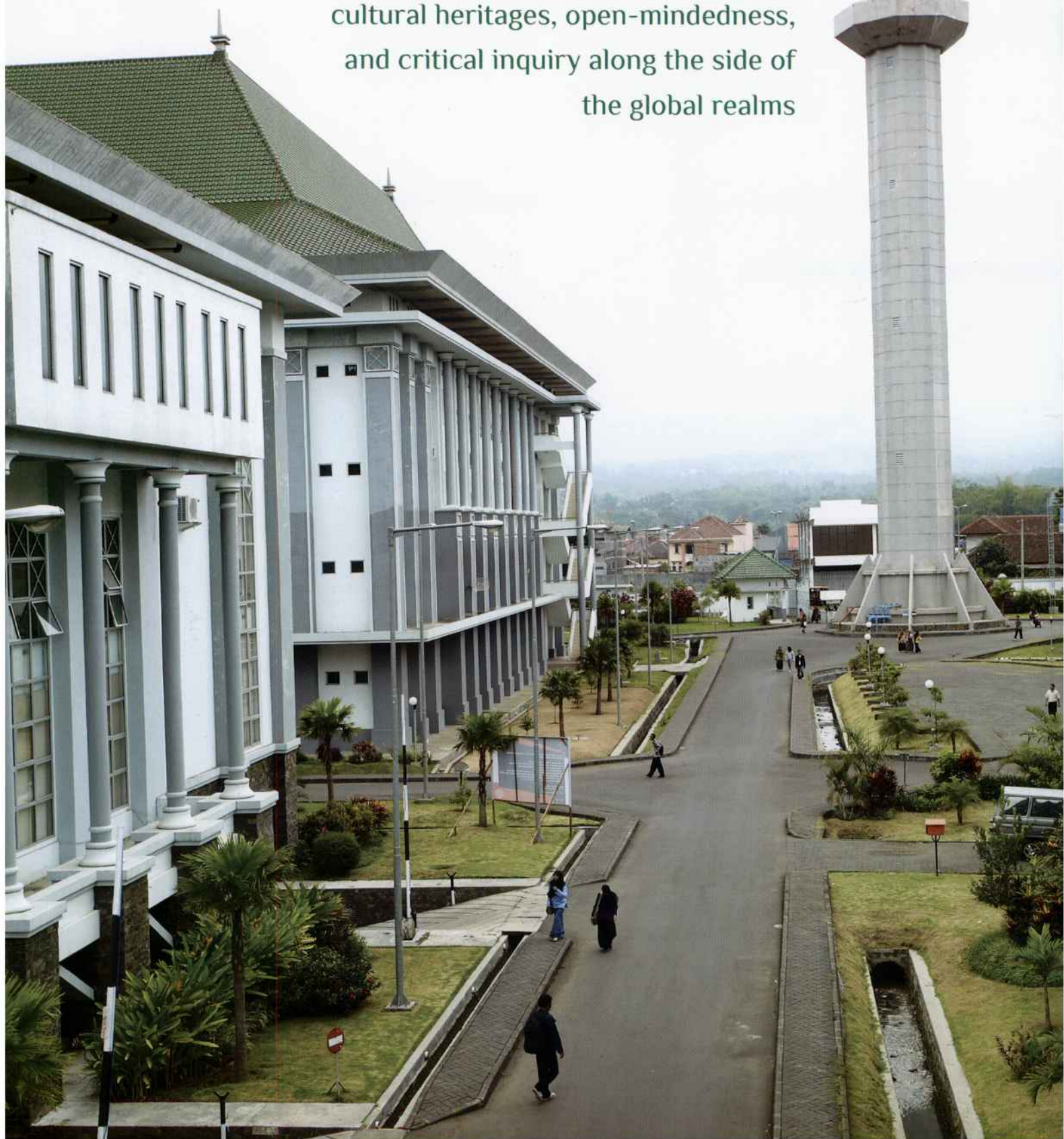

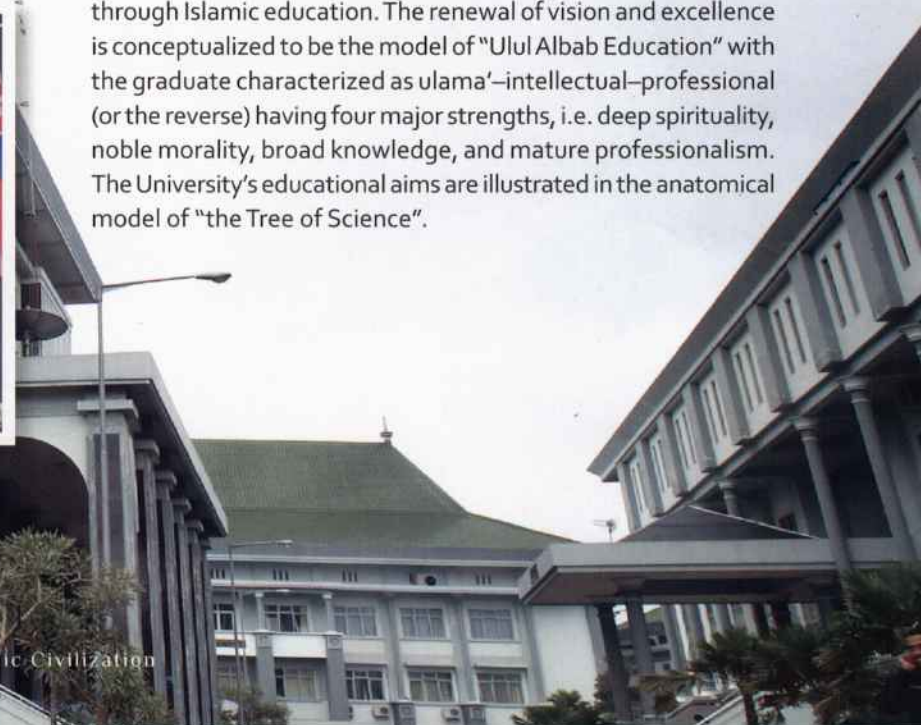

Philosophical Bases

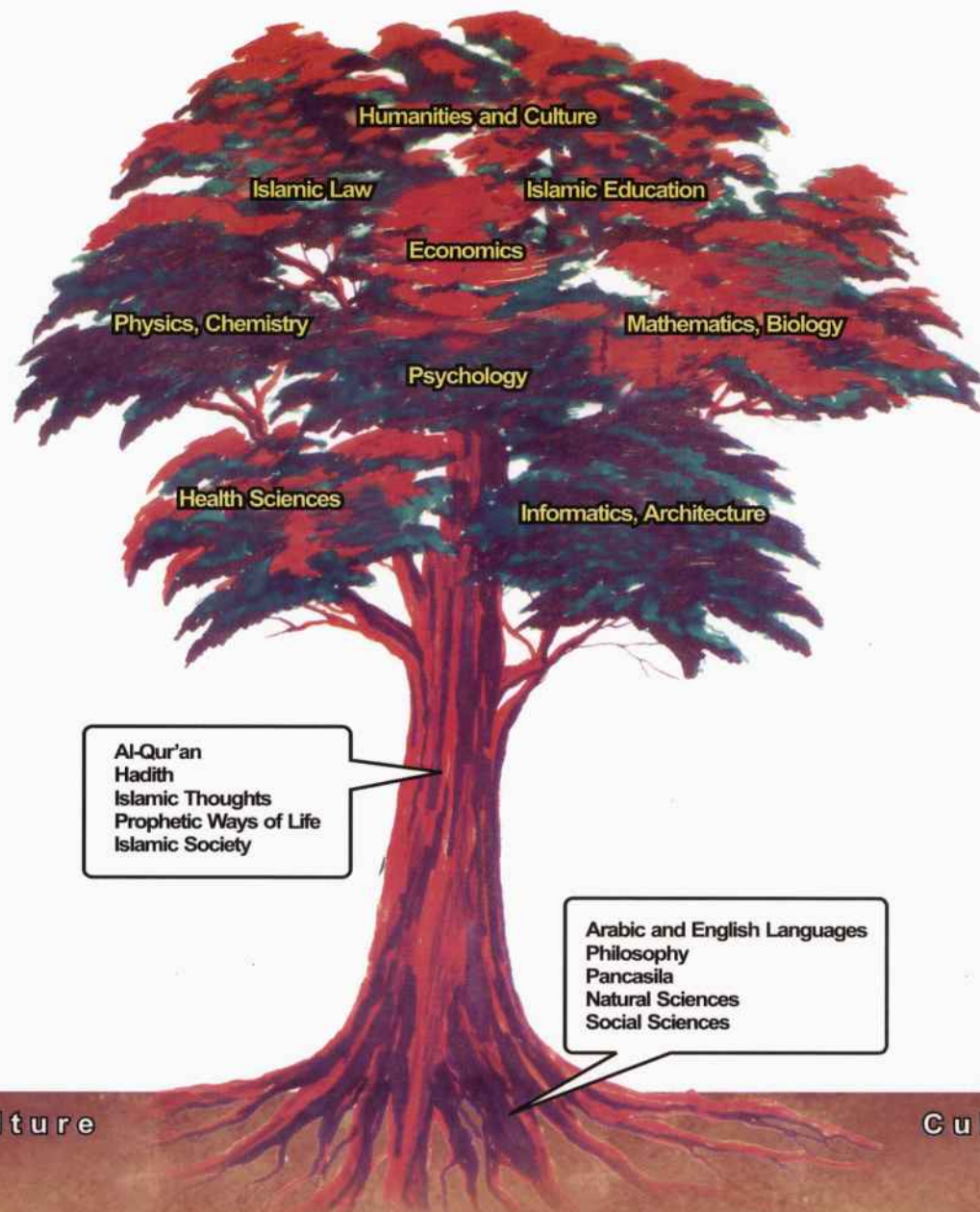
Maulana Malik Ibrahim State Islamic University, Malang extracts its own philosophy from the treasures of Islamic tradition, Indonesian culture, and novelty as the foundations of thought, attitude, and activity. In its position as the State Islamic Higher Education under the coordination of the Ministry of Religious Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia, the University has positioned itself as a strategic force in bequeathing the richness of civilization and Islamic thought. Al-Qur'an and the prophetic tradition are the foundations of knowledge that inspire the learning and research through philosophical thought and scientific method. Islamic studies as the cultural heritage of the Muslim community is placed as important intellectual modalities in its effort to develop the scientific paradigm based on the integration principle of science and religion.

In the Indonesian context, the University is an integral part of the national education system which has a central position in educating people and preserving the richness of Indonesian culture. Therefore, the University has consistently taken Pancasila and the UUD 1945 as its guidance in the implementation and development of educational programs. The University's educational purposes are referred to the mandate of the Indonesian law and based on institutional vision combining higher education and traditions of pesantren (Islamic boarding school). Pesantren itself, as an indigenous institution of education which is identical with the meanings of Islam and Indonesia, has been proven in producing many religious scholars with excellent characters of personality. Similarly, pesantren's educational orientation in mastering Islamic teaching within Ahlussunnah wal Jama'ah school of thought has to be considered as a viewpoint in spreading tolerance and peaceful Islam.

Looking at the very dynamic of contemporary era, the University positions itself as an inspiring and visionary institution in initiating the center of excellence and Islamic civilization through Islamic education. The renewal of vision and excellence is conceptualized to be the model of "Ulul Albab Education" with the graduate characterized as ulama'-intellectual-professional (or the reverse) having four major strengths, i.e. deep spirituality, noble morality, broad knowledge, and mature professionalism. The University's educational aims are illustrated in the anatomical model of "the Tree of Science".



The University's *Tree of Sciences*

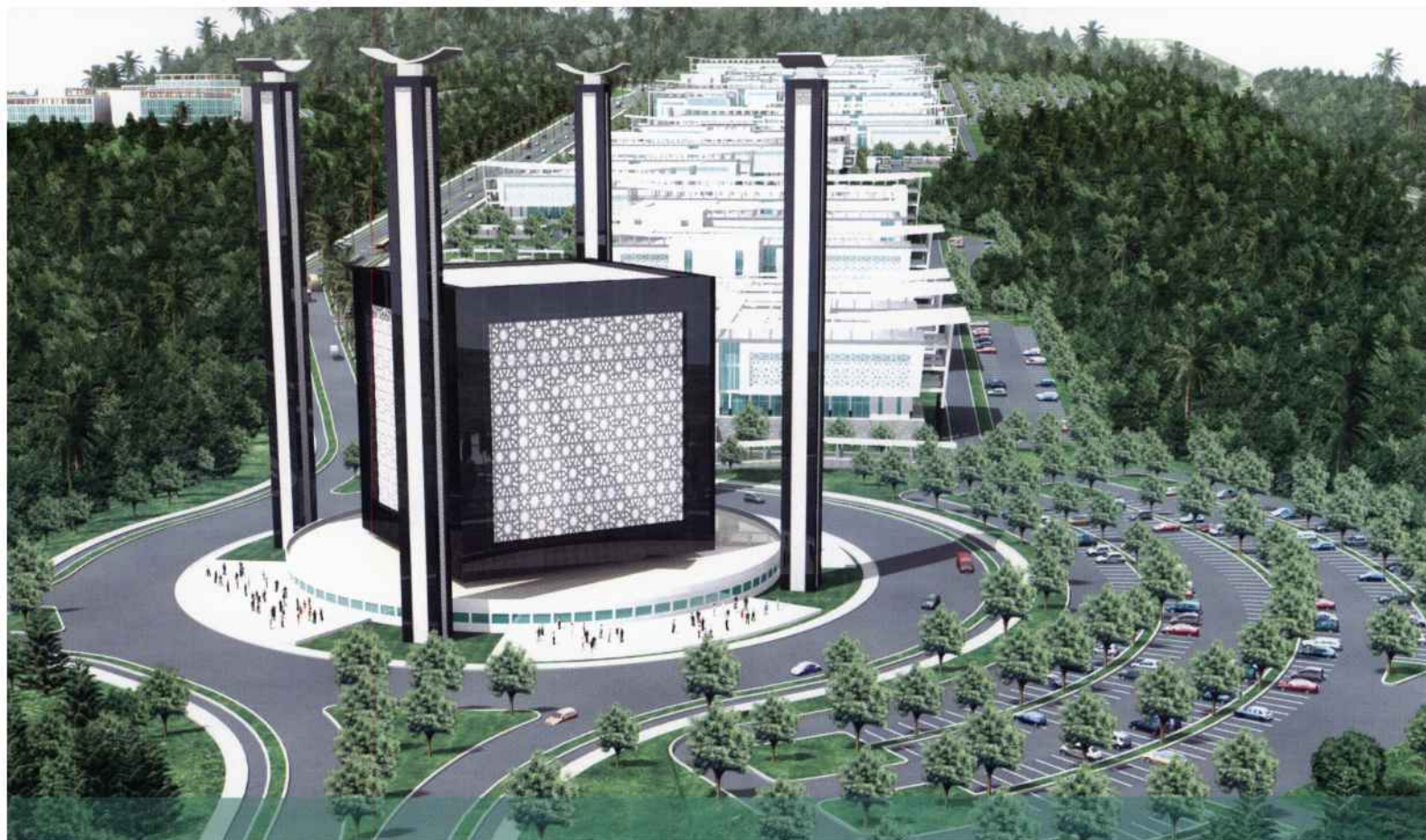

The University Pillars

Human Resources

Nearly 18,000 students are pursuing their study in the University's undergraduate and (post)graduate programs. They come from different provinces throughout Indonesia and from diverse countries like Russia, Slovakia, Bulgaria, Germany, Australia, Papua New Guinea, Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand, the Philippines, Cambodia, Saudi Arabia, Afghanistan, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, and Madagascar. The students attend academic activities with the guiding support of over 400 staffs for administrative, medical, and laboratorial affairs and 600 lecturers. Such qualified academicians provide brilliant help for students to study and carry out research.



Mosques

The university has built two great mosques, *Tarbiyah Mosque* and *Ulul Albab Mosque*, with the capacity of nearly 2,000 people for each. The mosques function more than mere spots for regular prayers; instead, they become the center for *tahfidz al-Qur'an* activities, Islamic studies, and academic discussions. The process of students' character building, morality establishment, and mentality development starts from and centers in these sites.





Ma'had

(Islamic Boarding School)

Ma'had is the most fundamental support for the dissemination of integration-based education system at the University. The students who are studying in their first academic year are required to live in *ma'had* and attend all mandatory programs, such as *Ta'lim al-Afkar al-Islamiyah* (Studies of Islamic Thought), *Ta'lim al-Qur'an* (Quran Studies), and Arabic and English Tutorials. Basically, *ma'had* plays three fundamental functions for students: acclimatizing them with academic traditions, creating bilingual environment for improving Arabic and English skills, and training to learn to live together. So far, the university has 11 dormitories, providing sufficient accommodation for over 3,000 students.

Library

The University's central library has collected nearly 300,000 titles of printed books and much more electronic and journals of different languages: Indonesian, Arabic, and English. It is supported by eight sub-libraries spread in each faculty. It offers more than 25,000 titles of latest literatures of specific fields. Its collections also include hundreds of CDs, magazines, newspapers, and research reports. Implementing digital-based system, the university's library has become one of modern libraries in Indonesian universities.



Laboratories

More than 60 modern laboratories can be accessed by students and lecturers to carry out academic research on their fields of study, especially those dealing with integration perspective of sciences and Islam.

Wide and Strong Financial Sources

The University develops business divisions providing financial sources for academia. It builds cooperation with overseas countries for business investment. A number of reputable banks in the world have agreed to invest at the University for beneficial and profitable businesses.



Offices

The University facilitates academic and administrative activities by providing adequate offices located in several buildings: the main (rectorate) building, the faculty buildings for undergraduate and (post) graduate degrees, student center, and study centers.

Classrooms

The University provides convenient classrooms equipped by modern LCD and CCTV. For particular needs, some of them are designed specifically and interestingly to build high academic culture. Classical teaching and learning model is combined with research and experimental models, most of which are conducted in laboratories. Hotspot facilities also influence the learning process as students may be flexible in choosing sites for learning.



Student Center for Art and Sport Development

The University concerns with the students' interests and talents on arts and sports. The activities are concentrated at the Student Center building. Until recently, a number of student unions have been established to channel and develop the students' interests and talents, such as on contemporary theater, *pencak silat* (martial art for self-defense) and Tae Kwon Do, research, journalism, photography, broadcasting, music, religious arts, traditional dances, choir, and sports.





Outstanding Programs



The Integration of Sciences and Islam

Since the beginning of the University's institutional development, the spirit for the implementation of integration perspective on sciences and Islam constantly presents. To meet this aim, the University has established the Institute for Qur'an and Science Studies. In addition, the University continually pushes the lecturers to broaden their knowledge with Qur'anic paradigm through research, community service programs, and book publishing. For the last four years, the University has published nearly 300 titles of books. The presence of these books is important to foster scientific realms and enrich literatures under the integration perspective.



Tahfidz al-Qur'an (Qur'an Memorization) Program

The tradition of tahfidz al-Qur'an is one of the University's excellent programs. A unit named Hai'ah Tahfidz al-Qur'an (HTQ) has been founded to facilitate the students' memorization activities. Recently, hundreds of students are involved in Qur'an memorization activities, such as tashhih hifdzul Qur'an (approving the memory on the Qur'an) by kyais (senior religious scholars), tadarrus Qur'an bil ghaib (reciting the Qur'an without reading its text), and learning Qur'anic interpretation. Its number rises up every year. The University offers scholarships to the memorizers during their undergraduate study period. Those gaining excellent academic achievements are even awarded scholarships for further study (Master and Doctorate degrees) in any well-recognized universities.

Intensive Programs of Arabic and English Language Learning

The University has pioneered an intensive program of Arabic language learning which later becomes the national program of Higher Islamic Education in the Ministry of Religious Affairs. Each student of any faculty is required to learn Arabic language for their first-year academic program starting from 02:00 pm to 08:00 pm. The program employs fun learning methods. It intensifies students to be Arabic literate to comprehend Qur'an, sunnah, and other Arabic literatures as to meet the basic requirement for integrating science and Islam. This program also applies to English language learning.





Indonesian Language and Culture Studies

The program is managed by the Center for Language and Culture Studies. It provides in-country and bridging courses on Indonesian language for overseas students. The learning process emphasizes on naturalistic and communicative approaches, facilitating the students to use Indonesian language extensively in everyday life interactions. The learning focus is the balance between productive (speaking and writing) and receptive (listening and reading) skills, supported by a number of grammar exercises and vocabulary.

In addition, the institute trains students to perform several Indonesian cultures, such as batik painting, mask crafting, karawitan, traditional dances, *pencak silat*, and calligraphy. To enrich the students' horizons on Indonesian-Islamic cultural values, the program also offers visits to *pesantrens* and religious sites.



“Ma’had Sunan Ampel Al-‘Aly” Islamic Boarding Program

This program supports the University's aim to internalize Islam-for-peace teachings and values through *pesantren* traditions. The students are taught Islamic tenets and nurtured to have deep spirituality and noble morality. The dormitory is supervised by a number of *kyais* and a supervisor board from Indonesia and overseas.

Faculty of *Tarbiyah* (Islamic Education)

Course of Islamic Education

The course prepares Islamic education teachers with outstanding cognitive, affective, and psychomotor skills to fulfill the demands and needs of national and international Islamic society.

Course of Social Science Education

The course is established to respond the society's needs toward qualified social science teachers of Primary and Secondary schools. It facilitates graduates to integrate social sciences, economics, and Islam and to perform entrepreneurship skills at national and international societies.

Course of Education for Primary School Teachers

The course prepares prospective teachers to apply teaching competencies at primary schools. It also helps them be thinkers and innovators of education.

Faculty Profile

The Faculty provides highly qualified education to prepare students for their teaching career in public and private schools, as well as in pesantren. This faculty helps students achieve personal, pedagogical, social, and professional competencies, aimed to create professional teachers in Islamic education. The Faculty systematically and constantly develops curriculum designs and evaluations, teaching-learning methodologies, and educational management in relation to Islamic values and academic morals.

Course of Arabic Language Education

This course aims to enable students to have comprehensive knowledge in Arabic education through studying Arabic Language Skills and Components, Approaches and Methods in Arabic Language Teaching, Curriculum Development in Arabic Language Education, Research in Language Teaching, and Current Issues in ALT (Arabic Language Teaching and Learning).

Course of Education for *Raudlatul Athfal* (Kindergarten) Teachers

The course prepares prospective teachers to apply teaching competencies at *Raudlatul Athfal* (Kindergarten). It also helps them be thinkers and innovators of early childhood education.





Course of Islamic Education Management

This course aims to enable students to have comprehensive knowledge in education management. This course offers innovative teaching and learning in order to equip the students with managerial skills. It is expected that the graduate will be able to become professionals in Islamic education management and contribute to the development of Islamic school and community.

Facilities and Services

The Faculty provides excellent facilities and services to support the students' academic performance: micro teaching laboratory, media and material development laboratory, the center of education and training for Islamic teachings, Islamic studies multi-media, faculty library, and academic journals.

Executive Program

It intensifies students' academic activities through foreign language programs, round table discussions, counseling supervisions, and bilingual class programs with Arabic and English as language instructions.





Faculty of Sharia (Islamic Law)

Faculty Profile

The faculty prepares students to understand and apply humane and cultural principles in the workplace and society based on Islamic teachings. Aside from that, the faculty facilitates students to be open-minded and critical intellectuals primarily in the field of language and literature. Fulfilling those qualifications, the graduates have great opportunities to work as teachers, educators, translators, journalists, tour guides, novelists, poets, public relation officers, embassy staff, etc.

Course of *Al-Ahwal al-Syakhsiyyah* (Islamic Family Law)

The course facilitates the graduates to be professionals in law institutions, such as religious court and religious affairs office. Its course units cover contemporary issues of Islamic Family Law in national and international level as well as discourse on classical Islamic law sources.

Course of *Sharia Business*

It fulfills the demand of sharia financial industries that develop very rapidly in current Islamic societies. The graduates are taught and trained to analyze and solve business problems through sharia and reorient the law in relation to the contemporary economic society.

Course of Islamic Politics and State Law (*Siyasah*)

The course facilitates the graduates to be professionals in state law with academic and professional competence in the field of Politics, State, and Islamic Law. The course is also committed to equip students with an ability to serve the community in the field of state and Islamic Law.

Facilities and Services

They cover Internet Access and Islamic Digital Collection, Falak (Astronomy) Laboratory, Law Laboratory, Turats (Islamic Classical Books) Laboratory, Center for Islamic Family Consultation, Association of Sharia Lawyers, Association of Sharia Scholars and Graduates, Center for Research, Publishing, and Social Services, Scientific Journals (de Jure for lecturers and Jurisdictie for students), etc.

Executive Program

The faculty opens bilingual class program for *Al-Ahwal al-Syakhsiyyah* with the partnership of Al-Azhar University, Egypt, as the sister university. The program provides teleconference facilities and international television network, memorization of Islamic Law verses and hadith, reading English and Arabic texts on Islamic law, discussion on the integration of contemporary issues with Islamic Law, recitation and critical analysis on classical Islamic books, court session practices, and field work.

Faculty of Humanities

Course of Arabic Language and Letters

This course enables students to gain profound knowledge in Arabic linguistics and literary studies. It offers: Compulsory Units in Arabic Language Skills and Components; Core Units in Arabic Linguistics and Literary Studies, Research Methodology in Linguistics, Literary Criticism; and Elective Units in Translation, Language Teaching, Guiding and Tourism, and Hajj (Pilgrimage).





Course of English Language and Letters

This course enables students to experience meaningful teaching and learning processes and gain broad knowledge in English Language Skills and Components, English (Pure and Applied) Linguistics, English Literary Studies, Linguistics Research, Literary Criticism, Cultural Studies, and Elective Units in Advanced Translation, Business English, TEFL (Teaching English as a Foreign Language), Guiding and Tourism and Journalism.



Supporting Facilities and Programs

To advance students' academic competencies, the faculty provides support facilities and services such as the Self Access Center (SAC), Center for Language Technology and Instructional Enrichment (CLTIE), Center for Language and Culture Studies (CLCS), Curriculum Resource Center (CRC), University Student Unions (USU), Accredited Journals, and a Home Theatre. The faculty is also supported by native speaker lecturers from diverse countries like Australia, the United States of America, United Kingdom, Egypt, UEA, Saudi Arabia, Morocco, and Sudan.



Faculty of Economics

Faculty Profile

Faculty of Economics aims to develop the students' ability to become scholars who excel in professional ability, ethics, integrity, and responsibility on economic knowledge. In addition, the faculty provides an insightful soul of entrepreneurship in the regional, national and global scope based on Islamic teachings and values.

Course of Management

This course is established in response to social demands for graduates possessing not only adequate management skills but also Islamic economist personalities. The course has exceptional academic activities for students, like internships, management seminars, and management units.

Course of Accounting

The course produces competent Moslem Scholars having basic research skills in the development of accounting disciplines. Through this course, the students are prepared not only to be experts on accounting but also to own Islamic personality qualifications as economists.

Course of Sharia Banking

This course is specifically designed to produce associate experts in finance and banking and professional skills for the development of Islamic Banking. This program leads the students to be professionals in *Sharia* banking.

Facilities and Services

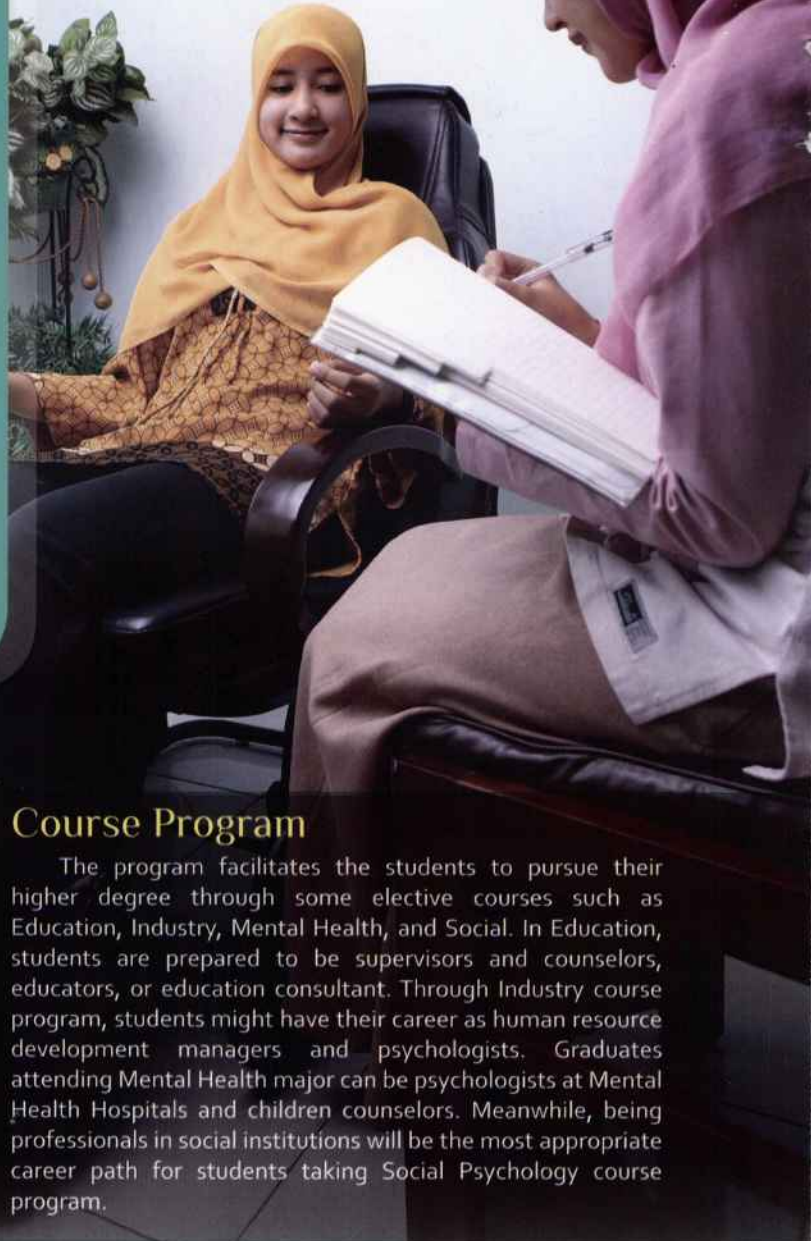

Faculty of Psychology

Faculty Profile

The faculty focuses on communication and psychological services. As the faculty develops competency-based curriculum integrated to Islamic values, the students are able to apply their knowledge on psychology in integration with Islamic perspectives. With these principles, the faculty aims to produce graduates' competence in relationship, assessment, intervention, research, and evaluation. Its graduates can build their career in any fields related to human resource development and social services.



Course Program

The program facilitates the students to pursue their higher degree through some elective courses such as Education, Industry, Mental Health, and Social. In Education, students are prepared to be supervisors and counselors, educators, or education consultant. Through Industry course program, students might have their career as human resource development managers and psychologists. Graduates attending Mental Health major can be psychologists at Mental Health Hospitals and children counselors. Meanwhile, being professionals in social institutions will be the most appropriate career path for students taking Social Psychology course program.



Facilities and Services

The faculty's facilities include libraries, laboratories of individual and classical psychology, psychometric laboratory, laboratory of applied psychology, and student support center. Services provide psychological test and assessment program for psychological placement test, majors, recruitment, and IQ tests. The services also cover social support to the program of natural disasters, drugs, children in trouble, and training programs in the field of AMT (Achievement Motivation Training), LMT (Learning Motivation Training), TOT (Training of Trainers), and Capacity and Character Building Training. Finally, the faculty provides Center of Applied Psychology which serves public community such as psychological counseling, training, and psychology tests.





Faculty of Science and Technology

Faculty Profile

The faculty improves the quality of human resources in science and technology associated with their practical basic sciences and Islam. The faculty strives for the revival of the medieval scientific tradition pioneered by Muslim philosopher– scientists like Ibn Sina, Al-Khawarizmi, Al-Biruni, Al-Tusi, and Ibn Hayyam. The courses facilitate scientific culture in Islamic world to support Muslim communities in the development of world civilization.

Course of Mathematics

The course aims at developing both theoretical and applied mathematics in response to the future challenges of modern scientific world and the need of society based on Islamic values. The course provides a wide range of mathematic disciplines, such as analytical mathematics, algebra, statistics, computation, and applied mathematics. The students are able to further develop research in sciences, statistical computer programs, and industrial companies.

This course has supporting facilities that include Elementary and Intermediate Mathematic Laboratory, Statistic Laboratory, Laboratory of Mathematical Modeling, and Internet Laboratory.

Course of Chemistry

This Course improves the students' cognitive abilities and work ethics, attitudes, and behaviors in terms of Islamic values. The course enables the students to analyze organic and inorganic materials, explore biochemistry, master Chemometrics, and develop chemist industries.

The supporting facilities are Basic Chemistry Laboratory, Analytical Chemistry Laboratory, Physical Chemistry Laboratory, Organic Chemistry Laboratory, Inorganic Chemistry Laboratory, Biochemistry Laboratory, Computational Chemistry Laboratory, Instrumentation Laboratory, and Chemical Warehouse Laboratory. The laboratories are equipped with AAS, FT-IR, HPLC, GC-MS, and UV-Vis Spectroscopy.



Course of Biology

The course aims to produce graduates who are able to develop molecular biology, tissue culture, and genetic engineering. This course is directed to integrate Biology science and Islamic values.

The course is supported by Microbiology Laboratory, Animal Physiology Laboratory, biosystematics Laboratory, Ecology Laboratory, Plant Physiology Laboratory, Biochemistry Laboratory, Genetics Research Laboratory, Bio-molecular Laboratory, and Green House Laboratory. The laboratories are equipped with the tools of sophisticated instruments including PCR and Real Time PCR, DNA Sequencers, inverted microscopy, transilluminator, Digital Autoclave, Ultra Centrifuge, Blood Analyzer, and Elisa Reader.



Course of Physics

This course develops the application of basic sciences into science and Islamic institutions. The development focuses on branches of physics: instrumentation, computation, geophysics, biophysics, materials, and theories. The students are able to apply pure and applied physics in their future career. In recent years, the course has engaged in the scientific world with currently under patent of dryers. The course has also piloted robotic projects to take part in the world's robotic contests.

The course has Basic Physics Laboratory, Mechanics Laboratory, Optical and Solid Substances Laboratory, Electric Field Laboratory, Acoustics Laboratory, Geophysical Laboratory, Atomic and Modern Physics Laboratory, Computing Laboratory, Thermodynamics Laboratory, Instrumentation Laboratory, Mechanical Workshop, Electronics Repair, and Alternative Energy Laboratory.

Course of Informatics Engineering

This course confidently teaches students with science, knowledge, and skills to compete in global markets. The students are able to develop computer programming, computer networking, web designs, and hardware maintenance.

It has several excellent facilities like Digital circuit Laboratory, Multimedia Laboratory, Artificial Intelligence Laboratory, Internet Laboratory, Research Laboratory, Database Laboratory, Programming Laboratory, and Networking and Data Communication Laboratory. To support students' knowledge of the latest technological developments, the Course carries out supporting activities such as regular Regional and National Seminars, Game Technology, Community Exploration Expertise Students, and ICT show.



Course of Architecture Engineering

The course administers professional education in architecture inspired by Islamic and Indonesian visions. This education results in Islamic scholars of architecture who foster their architectural knowledge and manifest modern Islamic-built styles. Besides, the graduates are able to respond to the dynamics of globalization, science, technology, and architecture.

Its facilities are Architecture Laboratory, Animation Architecture Laboratory, Urban and Regional Planning Laboratory, Science and Technology Laboratory, LAN Laboratory, Architecture Development Laboratory, Structures Laboratory, and several Workshops, Galleries, and Studios.

Course of Pharmacy

Pharmacy is a profession that works through mastery of the art and science of making drugs both natural and synthetic material. The course develops both theoretical and applied approaches in response to the future challenges of modern scientific world and the need of society based on Islamic values. The course provides a wide range of pharmacy disciplines, such as identification, selection, preservation, combination, pharmacological action, analysis and standardization of drugs and drug ingredients.

Course of Medicine

The course administers professional education in medicine inspired by Islamic and Indonesian worldview. The Course aims to produce qualified graduates that have competitive and comparative advantage in the global competition, capable of integrating medical science and Islamic values. Excellence of the course is science of medicine and health.

Graduate Program

Graduate program implements new paradigm of Islamic education. It undertakes research in education to create graduates to be thinkers, inventors, and discoverers as well as developers in their disciplines. Therefore, the program is designed in Islamic visions to be an excellent Islamic education institution through education and teaching activities, research, and social services. In addition, this program is intended to be the center of science development, technology, and Islamic arts as well as to be the agent of social change. It also provides best services and appropriate rewards for inventors and science and technology developers in Islamic culture and civilization.

Master Degree

The degree aims to create graduates who will be educators, professionals, philosophers, researchers, inventors, and developers of integrated sciences and Islam. The main objective of this program is to bring students to be competent masters in Islamic Education Management, Arabic Language Education, Islamic Studies, Education for Primary School Teachers, Islamic Education, Islamic Family Law, and *Sharia* Economics.



Doctorate Degree

The doctorate degree prepares the students to develop new concepts of research in particular field of studies and professions. This professional doctorate provides scholars to organize, implement, and lead research based on their expertise and profession, as well as to apply multi-disciplines in the approaches of integrated social sciences and Islam in relation to their academic and professional skills. The Doctorate Program offers three courses: Islamic Education Management, Arabic Language Education, and Islamic Education.

Facilities and Services

Facilities and services are available to support required competencies of the graduates: hotspot access, auditorium, and digital libraries, and multimedia classrooms. In addition, the students are regularly facilitated to join seminars and class sessions provided by overseas lecturers.



Supporting Facilities

Institute for Research and Development

The institute provides excellent services for developing and empowering research resources, disseminating research outcomes, promoting and advancing studies on Islamic fields, and expanding related institutional networks. The institute also offers a number of grants for outstanding research projects, especially those concerning the integration issues of sciences and Islam.



Institute for Public Service

The Institute provides social services and community development programs to improve the quality of social and religious life and organizations. Public assistance covers Islamic education, human resources, and dynamics of social and economic communities. This institute has developed several village models in the applications of Islamic-based science and technology.



Quality Life of University Assurance

This body aims at encouraging the dissemination of quality-based academic culture to uphold the university's vision. It provides training, consultancy, assistance, and cooperation within the fields of academic quality assurance and internal audit of academic quality. The primary function of the institute is supporting courses, faculties, and units to achieve international standard certification, such as ISO 9001:2000.

Study Centers

A number of study centers have been established to endorse and publish innovative studies of any existing fields. Until recently, the university has more than 20 study centers like Center for Social and Cultural Studies, Center for Science and Technology Studies, Center for Gender Studies, Zakat (Alms) and Waqf (Donation) House, Laboratory for Ulul Albab Education, Center for Science and Islam Integration Studies.

Printing and Publishing House

The institute facilitates lecturers and students to print and publish their works: books, journals, magazines, tabloids, etc. Two subordinate units being in charge of publishing tasks are UIN-Maliki Press (Printing and Publishing Unit) and Infopub (Information and Publication Unit).



Language Center

It provides language learning service for the University's students. It concerns on performing two main programs: Intensive Arabic Course and Intensive English Course. The students are trained for both languages in the first two years. The two courses are compulsory for the students of any faculties as the University requires its students acquire bilingual (Arabic-English) communication skills.

The former is generally intended to equip the students with adequate skill to elaborate Arabic literatures, especially the Qur'an and Hadits, as the main sources of Islamic studies; whereas the later aims to enable the students to communicate in English for general and academic purposes corresponding to the students' field of study. To achieve such a bilingual competence, the language center activities are supported by Self- Access Center (SAC) and Center for Language Technology and Instructional Enrichment (CLTIE), which allow the center to play another role as Language Study Center.





Institute for Tahfidz al-Qur'an (Qur'an Memorization)

The institute focuses on maintaining the tradition of tahfidz al-Qur'an of the university academicians by providing full access and scholarship to the huffadz students. In the last two years, more than 600 students are actively involved in the tahfidz al-Qur'an activities under the management of the institute.

Holdings and Business Center

The Center for Business Development is a professional commerce division which functions to organize funding sources. It manages, develops, and runs all business units of the University professionally, transparently, and accountably. The business units include Food Center, Supermarket, Bookstore, and Mini-bank.



Networking and Public Relation Affairs

The institute plays fundamental roles to widen network through the principle of mutual cooperation with any external parties to strengthen the University programs, promoting the University outcomes, improving the quality of the University service, and achieving the University goals. In general, it functions to build excellent reputation of and enhance public trust toward the University.





Community Service

The institute provides professional training courses and offers several services for the students:

- Academic consultancy. It advises and assists students on education affairs such as solving the students' learning difficulties, providing information about education development, etc.
- Job and career consultancy. It enables the students to gain information about job vacancies and opportunities. Through seminars, training courses, and career counseling, it prepares the students for bright future professional career.
- Overseas education consultancy. It provides students with supporting guides and valuable information about opportunities and scholarships for foreign courses and education.



Polyclinic

Such a mini-hospital provides health services for the university students, lecturers, and staffs. It is equipped by modern laboratories, a drugstore, in-patient rooms, patient care rooms, examination rooms, and ambulances.



Wi-fi (Hotspot) Network

The campus area is supported by excellent wireless network which enables all students and lecturers to access the Internet freely.

Student Unions

The University pays much attention to the students' extra curricular activities as they are important components of the overall educational processes. The followings are optional student unions available at the University:



Student Regiment

The union provides leadership training to implant discipline spirit and exercise habit to its members. The activities adapt soldierly exercise model combined with a number of strategic training courses.

Scout Union

The organization aims to develop the students' organizational and managerial skills. Conserving nature is channelled in this unit through camping activities.

Indonesian Red Cross Corps

The corps works for social-humanitarian mission. It functions to develop professionalism in the field of humanity and strong solidarity with fellow human beings based on piety and humankind spirits.

Pencak silat and Tae Kwon Do

The union provides two schools of self-defense martial art: Pencak silat and Tae Kwon Do. Both instill sportsmanship of every individual's soul. The presence of the units is necessary to preserve and develop the nation's cultural heritage in the field of sports and martial arts.

Club of Nature Lovers

It introduces students with adventurous familiar environment (conservation of natural resources and ecosystems), mountainering, rock climbing, rafting, and cave searches. The club aims to foster the students' sense of love and ownership upon the nature and their awareness to preserve the environment as the embodiment of Islamic values.

Sports Unit

The unit provides activities to improve the students' strength of stamina. It channels the students' interests in sports: football, volleyball, basketball, badminton, table tennis, etc.

Contemporary Comedy Theater

The unit accommodates the students' talents in a theatrical art. It leads the students be appreciative, productive, and creative in performing the art.

Campus Radio

The students' communication skill through electronic mass media is developed in the unit of "Symphony" Campus Radio. The campus radio, which broadcasts on 104.1 MHz frequency, aims at developing the students' potency in broadcasting field.



Community of Music (Commus)

"Commus" is a student union making the musical institutions not merely as a means of entertainment but also as the object of research. It strives to develop the students' musical art as an effective propaganda tool to develop the community.

Photography Club

The club hones the students' interest in the field of photography. The exposure on photographic activities would boost their artistic talent in the form of camera products.

Student Press

The unit aims at developing the students' talent and interest in journalism. Its program, such as magazine, tabloid, and newsletter publications, familiarize the students with the communication world through printed mass media.



Group for Religious Art Development

It copes with the student's interest in several branches of Islamic art: calligraphy, music, Qur'an recitation, etc.



Institute for Studies, Research, and Student Development

The institute develops the students' research knowledge and skills in various fields of study. It trains their academic sensitivity toward critical, rational, and dynamic ways of thinking.



International Student Affairs (ISA)

As a unit in charge of assisting overseas students, the ISS provides academic guidance, daily matter advise, information on tuition fee and scholarship, and administration for sponsored students. The unit carries out a number of activities to help foreign students adapt to Indonesian way of life and the University's academic culture. In cooperation with the Center for Indonesian Language and Culture Studies (CILCS), the unit offers both intensive tutorials of Indonesian language and extensive training of Indonesian culture. The tutorials apply naturalistic and communicative approaches, while the training is carried out through extensive participation in several workshops with excellent guide from professional trainers. The optional cultural activities for international students include batik painting, karawitan, traditional dance, pencak silat, mask crafting, cooking Indonesian traditional food, etc. The unit also provides outstanding tour guide, as well as any travel needs, for students to visit natural, historical, and religious (such as Wali Songo graveyard) sites.



The City of Malang

Malang is the second largest city in East Java Province, the Republic of Indonesia. Malang's population is nearly 800,000 people, spread over an area of 110 km². Malang is a well-known tourism city with its beautiful mountains, high hills in the west of the city to dozens of parkland taking advantage of the views, restaurants, and beaches in the south. Mountains and waterfalls are within an hour and half from most campuses – a few minutes away from some – while a number of Malang's most popular gardens, "Apple Agro-tourisms", are just fifteen minutes away. From fashion, food and amusements, to national parks, serene surroundings in the east and beaches in the south, Malang offers an excellent base for students.



Climate

Malang's climate is temperate with two distinct seasons. In dry season, with many cool days frequently and approximately 19°C, the city's beaches and mountains are popular, while culinary sites are often more visited during wet season.

Arts and culture

From Malang's batik and native mask handicrafts amusing people on the city street to the cultural dances of *Tari Topeng* (mask dance) and *Jaran Kepang* (horse-braid dance), Malang's diverse arts and cultures are confidently to inspire and entertain visitors. People can listen to live music at a variety of venues around the city, including of the University campuses.

Parks and gardens

Lovely parks and gardens, some of which are Dutch Colonial heritages, offer an idyllic escape from hectic city life. They make great visiting all year around.



Food

Malang is habitually referred to as the culinary city in East Java. This is not surprising as the city is home to more than hundreds of delicious inexpensive food. People can find something to suit their taste and price range easily.

Shopping

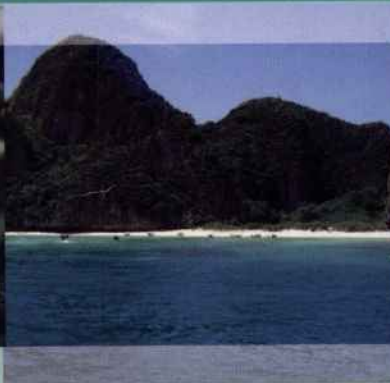
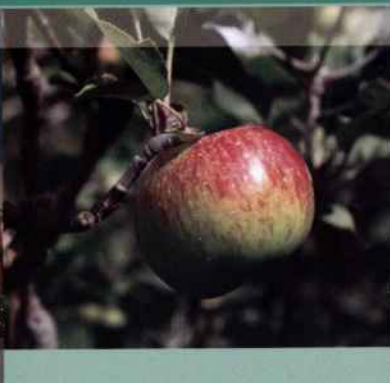
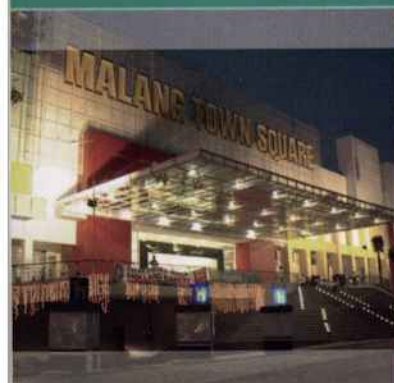
Malang sells unlimited item choices, from fashion to furniture, in many venues of shopping. From bargain outlets to designer wear of local textiles such as batik, Malang becomes Indonesia's shopping city.

Sport

Malang has sport that is always in the air: soccer, rafting, tennis, golf, swimming, and mountain climbing. People can participate in or be spectators of the sport anytime.

Arriving in Malang

Arriving in a new country or city is always exhilarating but often requires some adjustment. Those who are new to Malang are suggested to arrive at least two weeks before their studies begin to arrange accommodation and settle into new surroundings.



Airport Reception for New International Students

The airport reception service is offered to all new international students and can be booked in advance of the arrival. It includes pick-up from the airport and delivery to the nominated place of accommodation.

Accommodation and Cost of Living

There is a wide range of accommodation for students in Malang. Accommodation costs vary depending on the desired type, quality, and location.





On-campus accommodation

The University provides on-campus residence for students of the first academic year. Unfortunately at this stage, families cannot be accommodated within the student residential system. Students in this situation can get help finding off-campus rental accommodation from the University.

Residence fees during academic year is between \$US 500 and 750 excluding health assurance and food. Food costs can be monthly estimated between \$US 150 and 200 in which food can be bought at the residence canteen or catering.





Off-campus accommodation

Off-campus accommodation is available in many options:

Homestay

Homestay offers more than a place to live with an Indonesian family. It provides a safe environment in which students can live with a family in their home. This is a perfect way that students can immerse in the Indonesian way of life and get benefit from practicing their Indonesian skills with host family.

Private Rental Accommodation

This accommodation offers an empty house, but any establishment cost involved in renting, including the security bond, is already covered. Students should pay electricity connection, gas, and telephone per month. If the house is shared with other students, everyone shares the kitchen, bathroom, and living room.

Travelling to the campuses

Regardless where students live, Malang's comprehensive public transport system facilitates them to get around the campuses and the surrounding suburbs. Various means of transportation is available from buses, angkots, taxis, cars, motorcycles, and bicycles.





Registration
